Conc	usions for Discipleship

1. Knowing Christ is much more than initial salvation. It is a relationship between the Lord and his disciple which grows more personal over time. This relationship is cultivated over time through the study of God's Word, faithfulness to talking with God through prayer, and our obedience to the Lord.

- 2. Knowing Christ is only possible because of Christ; therefore, only through the power of Christ will we be able to have an enriched spiritual relationship with the Lord.
- 3. Growing into spiritual maturity is done intentionally.
- 4. Growing in the knowledge Christ will result in increased faithfulness to the Great Commission which Christ gave us.
